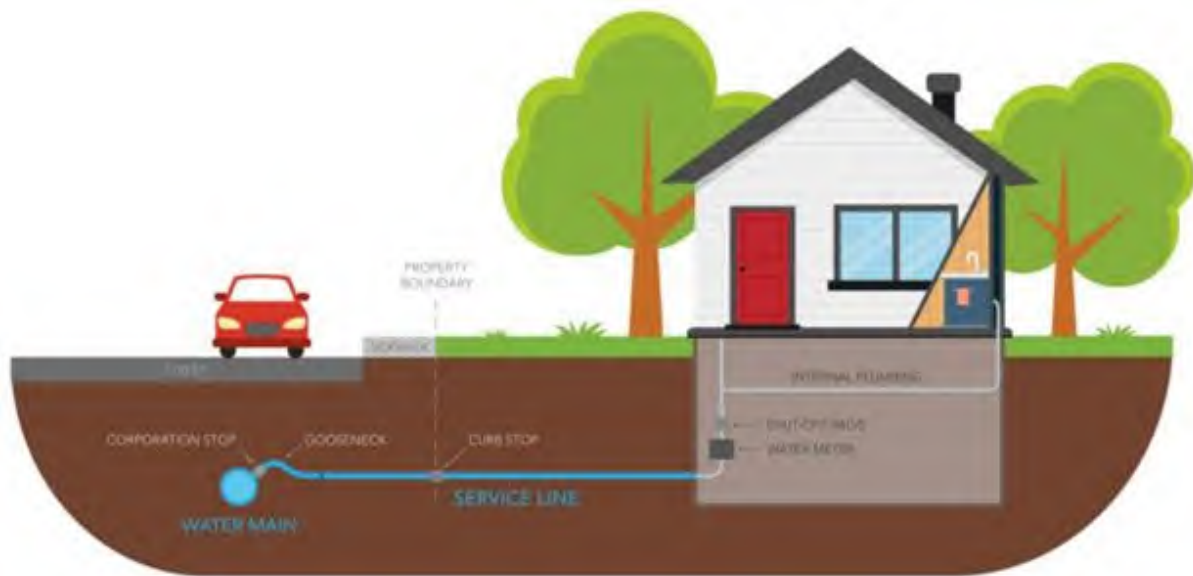


LEAD SERVICE LINE IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM

In July 2021, Governor Phil Murphy signed into law P.L. 2021, Ch.183 (law) requiring community water systems in New Jersey to identify any lead or galvanized service lines in the street and/or on the property leading to a residential or commercial connection. Our service line inventory is available via the link below.

A service line is a portion of pipe that connects the water main to the building inlet (refer to the photo below). Ownership of the service line varies by water system, but for The Brick Township Municipal Utilities Authority (BTMUA), the service line is partially owned by BTMUA (street to curb) and partially by the property owner (curb to house).



Based on our review of available records and visual observations, BTMUA believes that there are no lead or galvanized service lines on the BTMUA side or the property owner's side. The service lines are composed of either polyethylene plastic or copper. If it is discovered that lead or galvanized service lines exist, we will notify the customer via mail in accordance with the law. Additionally, if you believe that you do have a lead or galvanized service, please contact Customer Service at 732-458-7000 to schedule an appointment for us to inspect your line.
