



Construction of upgrades and improvements to the Brick Township Municipal Utilities Authority (BTMUA) William Miller Jr. Water Treatment Plant, Brick Township, Ocean County, New Jersey, were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (Infrastructure Bank) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA), the DEP, and the Infrastructure Bank to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

This project will provide water quality benefits and enhancements for residents and businesses in BTMUA's service area, which includes Brick Township and the Ramtown section of Howell Township, Monmouth County, as well as customers serviced by bulk sales including Point Pleasant Beach Borough, Point Pleasant Borough and Lakewood Township.
