A Resolution for the Award of an Emergency Contract to National Water Main Cleaning Company in the amount of \$266,349.90 for Cleaning and Evaluating and Assessing Current Conditions for Brick Township's Barrier Island Sanitary Sewer Lines Along NJ State Highway Route 35

Northbound

WHEREAS, the existing 16,000 linear feet (approximate) of eight inch (8") diameter sanitary sewer lines along NJ State Highway Route 35 Northbound were affected as a result of the Superstorm Sandy event; and

WHEREAS, the Brick Utilities determined that initially each length of existing sanitary sewer lines would have to be jet vacuumed and cleaned of any debris that was deposited within the sanitary sewer lines as a result of the calamity; and

WHEREAS, subsequently providing a close circuit television inspections (CCTV) of each of the existing cleaned sanitary sewer lines to evaluate and assess their current conditions and integrity; and

WHEREAS, in the event that the CCTV inspections discovers that some of the existing sanitary sewer lines were damaged as a result of the calamity, provide all labor, equipment and materials in order to have the necessary repairs completed to any damaged sanitary sewer lines; and

WHEREAS, James F. Lacey, Executive Director of the Brick Utilities, Stephen T. Specht, P.E., Deputy Executive Director/Director of Engineering & Operations of the Brick Utilities and the Commissioners of the Brick Utilities determined the situation to be an emergency affecting public health, safety and welfare and the Board of Commissioners on November 26, 2012 authorized emergency cleaning, evaluation and repairs without public advertising for bids; and

WHEREAS, six contractors were contacted and were requested to submit bids for providing the cleaning operation and the CCTV inspection operation as well as the providing all labor, equipment and materials in order to complete any repairs to damaged existing sanitary sewer lines located along NJ State Highway Route 35 Northbound within the Brick Township's Barrier Island; and

WHEREAS, three bids were received on December 14, 2012, however one bid was received after the 2:00 bid opening time; this late bid was not opened and subsequently returned; and

WHEREAS, the two bids that were opened ranged from a low of \$266,349.90 to a high of \$421,778.90 as more fully set forth pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Law specially N.J.S.A. 40:11-6 which permits the awarding of emergency contracts; and

WHEREAS, Frank Planko, Chief Financial Officer, has advised Brick Utilities that internal funds of \$266,349.90 will be utilized for payment for the storm related projects that are anticipated to be reimbursed by FEMA.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE BRICK TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY as follows:

- 1. National Water Main Cleaning Company is awarded a contract in the amount of \$266,349.90 for cleaning and evaluating and assessing the current conditions for approximately 16,000 linear feet (approximate) of the existing sanitary sewer lines along NJ State Highway Route 35 Northbound located within the Brick Township's Barrier Island and for any damaged sections of existing sanitary sewer lines complete the necessary repairs for the damaged sections of sanitary sewer lines as the lowest priced bid proposal from a contractor.
- This contract is being awarded without public advertising for bids pursuant to an emergency situation affecting public health safety and welfare and as authorized by the Local Public Contracts Law, specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 which permits the awarding of emergency contracts; and
- The Executive Director is authorized to return the bid bonds and other security received from the unsuccessful bidder within three (3) days after execution of the contract and to notify all bidders of the award of the contract; and
- The proper officers of the Authority are authorized to execute a contract with National Water main Cleaning Company, 875 N. Summer Avenue, Newark, NJ for this project; and
