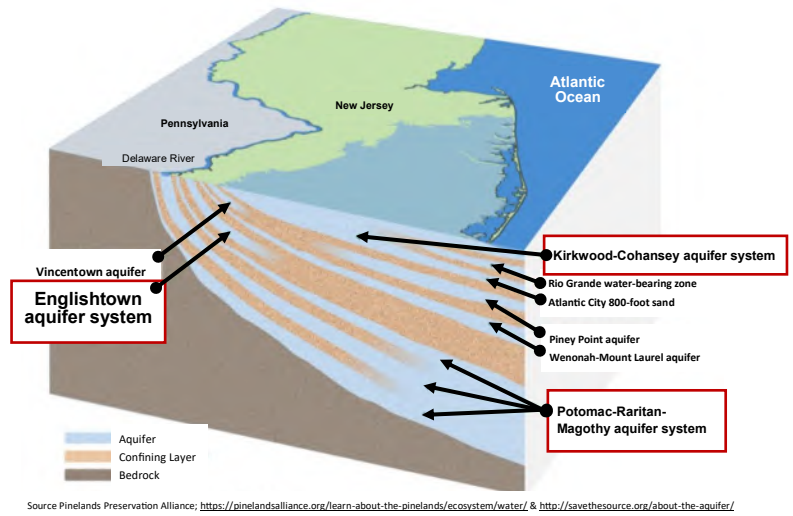


Welcome to Water Savings!

Where does our water come from?

Approximately 80% of our water supply comes from the Metedeconk River Watershed. The remaining 20% comes from Wells that are drilled in the Kirkwood-Cohansey, Englishtown and Potomac-Raritan-Magothy Aquifers.



Why save water?

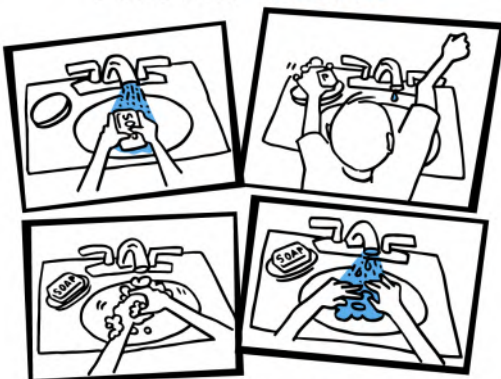
Not all of Earth's water is available for our use. Approximately 97% is saltwater and 3% is freshwater. Of that 3% freshwater, only 1% is available for our needs, while the other 2% is locked in ice and snow. As our population increases, there are more demands for our limited available water supplies. When we have periods of drought there is even less available water for our needs. We all need to adopt water saving strategies to ensure a reliable supply for future generations.

What is WaterSense?

WaterSense is a partnership program sponsored by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). It is both a label for water-efficient products and a resource for water-saving tips. The WaterSense label is a simple way for you to identify water-efficient products, new homes, and landscape irrigation professionals.
